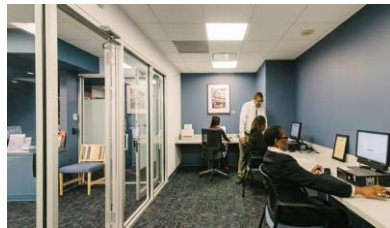

The Creative Spark grant is designed to meet DCCAH's goal of developing the creative capacity of children and youth in the city. The public hearing is being held to ensure that all citizens have the opportunity to present their views concerning funding priorities. The block grant supports programs operated by CHA and community-based organizations that address chronic disease, injury, primary care and access to healthcare. Presentations should address a specific area of focus; for example: asthma, youth/domestic violence, teen pregnancy, oral health, physical activity/exercise, nutrition and healthy eating.
