**Request for Peer Reviewers.** The District of Columbia Government - Office of Victim Services and Justice Grants (OVSJG) is currently accepting applications for Peer Reviewers. OVSJG relies on the expertise of Peer Reviewers to produce qualified recommendations for victim and justice service providers for the District of Columbia community. If selected as a Peer reviewer, the Reviewers will have up to 30 days to read and score a minimum of

10 grant applications from service providers that address: treatment to victims of crime by providing assistance and services necessary to speed the victim's restoration after a violent criminal act, and to support and aid them as they move through the criminal justice process in the District of Columbia. Peer Reviewers will also review grant applications from service providers who can address: truancy reduction in elementary and middle schools; juvenile delinquency; enrichment programs for citizens returning from correctional institutions. **Pro Bono Professional Services.** The Taproot Foundation Offers Pro Bono Professional Services to Nonprofit Organizations by connecting nonprofit organizations with professional consultants on a pro bono basis. Each service grant has a minimum value of \$45,000 and is delivered by a team of five to six business professionals who donate their time and expertise to nonprofit organizations in Washington, D.C. To qualify for a grant, applicants must be a 501(c) (3) tax-exempt organization or a public school and work within one of the foundation's program areas (i.e., the arts, education, the environment, health, and social services). To be eligible for a grant, organizations also must have at least three full-time employees and an annual budget of at least \$350,000.
