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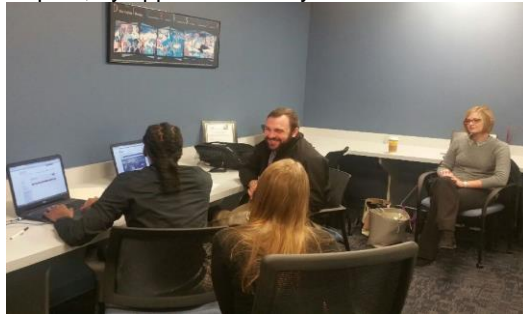

Call for National Environmental Education Foundation (NEEF) Grant Reviewers. NEEF is seeking individuals to serve as reviewers for their upcoming grant competitions. NEEF typically administers 7-10 grant competitions each year that invite educational (both formal and informal) and public land partners (primarily Friends Groups), across the country to apply for funding. Requests for Proposals vary year-to-year but typically solicit proposals for the projects that accomplish the following: provide STEM education in a place-based context; build the capacity of Friends Groups to support their public land partners; and execute events that are educational, recreational, and/or volunteer-based. This is an excellent opportunity to learn more about the grant-making process, develop your own grant-writing skills, learn about exciting trends in environmental education and public lands engagement, and contribute your knowledge and experience to our efforts to select high-quality programs and organizations for funding. Reviewers with prior experience with environmental education, public lands, nonprofit management, or grants management are especially encouraged to inquire. Reviewers must be comfortable reading applications within a given period and providing analysis and commentary. Free Nonprofit Legal Clinic: Understanding the Building Blocks of Good Governance. The DC Bar Pro Bono Program is hosting a "Free Nonprofit Legal Clinic: Understanding the Building Blocks of Good Governance" on June 16 from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. As you know, good governance policies are a critical part of every nonprofit's foundation, which is why the IRS Form 990 asks all Sec. 501(c)(3) organizations to indicate whether they have conflict-of-interest, whistleblower and record retention policies. At this clinic, you will meet one-on-one with an attorney who will help review and update your nonprofit's whistleblower and record retention policies and your

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conflict-of-interest policy and disclosure form. The attorney will also discuss with you the reasons the policies say what they do, and how best to implement them. Finally, the attorney will discuss with you some actions you can take now, so you know how to handle issues when they come up.
