Fiscal Year 2019 Out of School Time Requests for Proposals. The Office of the Deputy Mayor for Education (DME) announces the release of the Out-of-School-Time (OST) Requests for Proposals (RFP). Learn24, located in the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Education (DME), is a citywide initiative to ensure children and youth ages 5 - 21 have access to quality educational and enrichment activities beyond the regular school day. The DME partners with United Way of the National Capital Area (United Way NCA) to release these RFPs. The School Year 2018-19 OST RFP supports any entity that provides OST programming to apply for up to \$100,000 per application. A new competition, School Year 2018-19 Community Based RFP, supports community based organizations with budgets under \$250,000 to apply for grants up to \$25,000. The DME anticipates, upon selection of the FY19 grantmaking partner, awarding continuation grants to the organizations who currently receive School Year 17-18 grants. These organizations are serving over 20,000 children and youth across the District. Across the three grant opportunities, the DME anticipates funding over 80 organizations and distributing over \$5 million in grants to ensure children and youth have access to quality OST programming during the school year. Free Nonprofit Legal Clinic: Understanding the Building Blocks of Good Governance. The D.C. Bar Pro Bono Center is sponsoring a free legal clinic on conflict-of-interest, whistleblower and record retention policies on June 21 from 10:30 am to 12:30 noon. The clinic will be held at Morrison & Foerster, 2000 Pennsylvania Avenue NW. The IRS has requirements regarding conflicts of interest and public disclosure of your tax filings, while the D.C. Nonprofit Code requires a nonprofit to maintain certain corporate records. Often, a Board adopts the policies, attaches them to the meeting minutes, and forgets about them. While all Sec. 501(c)(3) organizations should have well-drafted conflict of interest, record retention and whistleblower policies, it is just as important that organizations educate their directors, employees and volunteers about the policies and develop a plan to implement them. At this clinic, you will meet one-on-one with an attorney who will help review and update your nonprofit's whistleblower and record retention policies and your conflict of interest policy and disclosure form. The attorney will also discuss with you the reasons the policies say what they do, and how best to implement them. Finally, the attorney will discuss with you some actions you can take now, so you know how to handle issues when they come up. Contact Lauren Paley at lpaley@dcbbar.org to register.
