The School Year 2018-19 OST RFP supports any entity that provides OST programming to apply for up to \$100,000 per application. A new competition, School Year 2018-19 Community Based RFP, supports community based organizations with budgets under \$250,000 to apply for grants up to \$25,000. The DME anticipates, upon selection of the FY19 grantmaking partner, awarding continuation grants to the organizations who currently receive School Year 17-18 grants. These organizations are serving over 20,000 children and youth across the District.
