Many Hands Foundation FY2019 Grant Applications. Nonprofit organizations serving women, children, and families in the Washington DC area are available to apply for the Many Hands Foundation 2019 grant award. Four grants are awarded each year up to \$100,000. Letters of Intent are required from organizations interested in applying for the grant. The Many Hands Grants committee reviews the LOI's and qualified organizations will be referred to one of four Focus Area Committees -- Education, Health, Housing and Job Readiness -- for further consideration. In April, each Focus Area Committee will request detailed financial information from the three organizations it considers best suited to receive the \$100,000 grant. In May, each committee will select one finalist to present to Many Hands donors for a vote. One organization will receive \$100,000. Other finalists will receive smaller grants. Last year, the smaller grants were \$40,500 each.
