Building a Budget, Understanding Allowable Expenses and Tying Cost Estimates into Budget Narratives Workshop. The DC Criminal Justice Coordinating Council's Grants Planning Committee cordially invites you to *Building a Budget, Understanding Allowable Expenses and Tying Cost Estimates into Budget Narratives*. Often given less attention than program narratives or project abstracts, budgets and budget narratives are critical to demonstrating that your organization understands what is needed to execute a proposed initiative or intervention. Through this training, attendees will hear directly from grant-makers on best practices, common mistakes, and tricks to improving your ability to build a budget for a fundable project. Many Hands Foundation FY2019 Grant Applications. Nonprofit organizations serving women, children, and families in the Washington DC area are available to apply for the Many Hands Foundation 2019 grant award. Four grants are awarded each year up to \$100,000. Letters of Intent are required from organizations interested in applying for the grant. The Many Hands Grants committee reviews the LOI's and qualified organizations will be referred to one of four Focus Area Committees -- Education, Health, Housing and Job Readiness -- for further consideration. In April, each Focus Area Committee will request detailed financial information from the three

organizations it considers best suited to receive the \$100,000 grant. In May, each committee will select one finalist to present to Many Hands donors for a vote. One organization will receive \$100,000. Other finalists will receive smaller grants. Last year, the smaller grants were \$40,500 each. The Renewal Awards. The Renewal Awards program, sponsored by The Atlantic and the Allstate Insurance Company, was created to celebrate the social innovation demonstrated by nonprofit organizations that are finding creative solutions to America's most pressing problems. The program recognizes these organizations and individuals as they drive positive change in their communities, and helps them make an even bigger impact. Five winners will each receive \$20,000 in funding from Allstate; one of the winners will additionally be presented with the Allstate Youth Empowerment Award. The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards. The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards is a nationwide program that honors young people in grades five to twelve who are volunteering in their communities. The program's goals are to applaud young people who already are making a positive difference in their towns and neighborhoods, and to inspire others to think about how they might contribute to their communities. Youth who have engaged in a volunteer activity that occurred during the twelve months prior to the date of application are eligible to apply. Local Honorees are selected in late fall and from those winners two State Honorees (one middle level school student and one high school student) are chosen in each state and the District of Columbia. State Honorees receive an award of \$1,000 and an all-expenses-paid trip to Washington, DC, for national recognition events. Out of the State Honorees, ten National Honorees are selected to receive an additional award of \$5,000 as well as a \$5,000 grant for a nonprofit organization of their choice.
