Each service grant has a minimum value of \$45,000 and is delivered by a team of five to six business professionals to nonprofit organizations in Washington, D.C. To qualify for a grant, applicants must be a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization

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or a public school and work within one of the foundation's program areas (i.e., the arts, education, the environment, health, and social services). To be eligible for a grant, organizations also must have at least three full-time employees and an annual budget of at least \$350,000. What Your Nonprofit Needs to Know About the New Overtime Regulations. The D.C. Bar Pro Bono Center, in conjunction with the law firm of Littler Mendelson, will be hosting a free workshop for nonprofits about how to deal with the new overtime regulations July 21, from 9:00 A.M. – 11:00 A.M. at Littler Mendelson, 815 Connecticut Ave., NW. Last month, the Department of Labor published new rules that change the rules regarding which employees are eligible for overtime pay. Under these rules, beginning December 1, 2016, employees who earn less than \$913 per week (\$47,476 per year) are automatically eligible for overtime pay when they work more than 40 hours a week, regardless of what their job duties are. This new rule could have a significant impact on your nonprofit's personnel costs. At the workshop, the facilitator will review the difference between exempt and non-exempt employees; what the new overtime regulations provide and how they will impact your organization; what steps your organization should be taking now so you are ready for December 1; and how these changes will impact your responsibilities under other federal and local laws, including the DC Wage Theft Prevention Act. Lacrosse Grants. US Lacrosse Foundation is accepting applications for 2016 physical education lacrosse workshop grants and soft lacrosse equipment grants. Soft lacrosse is a co-ed version of lacrosse that utilizes plastic sticks with specially molded-heads and a large, soft ball. This modified equipment is designed for youth to achieve quick success executing the basics skills of lacrosse (cradling, scooping, passing, catching and shooting). No additional protective equipment is required. The US Lacrosse Soft Lacrosse Equipment Grant, targeted for schools and community-based organizations, provides a set of 30 soft lacrosse sticks, 30 soft lacrosse balls, one (1) copy of the US Lacrosse Physical Education Curriculum Guide and (1) copy of the Teaching Soft-Stick Lacrosse DVD.
