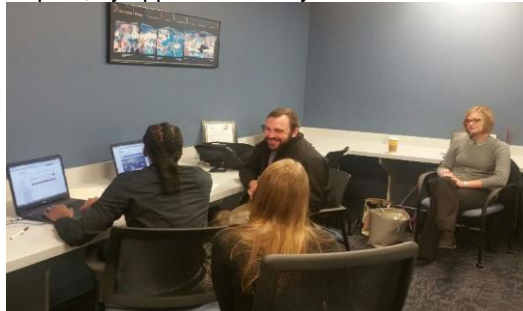

OSSE's Division of Elementary, Secondary, and Specialized Education (ESSE) seeks individuals to serve as volunteer or paid peer reviewers for several grant competitions for release in 2017. OSSE seeks to establish a pool of neutral, qualified professionals who have knowledge, skills or expertise in one or more of the following areas: increasing academic achievement and improving educational outcomes in public elementary and secondary schools; early childhood education; alternative and adult education; college and career readiness; teacher recruitment, retention, and improvement; after-school and out-of-school time activities; community partnerships, health and social services, youth and community development, and community engagement; serving homeless and at-risk children and youth; collecting, analyzing and using data to inform school improvement strategies; curriculum design; specialized education for students with disabilities and English learners; school improvement; school construction and renovation, including construction finance; and science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).
